Our dedication to our mission statement has been the driving force of our reputation as a place of care and food. Supporting our community with hospitality, respect, and nutritious food has been possible because of our incredible volunteers, donors, community partners, and staff. You make this mission possible.

Each week, we serve around 2,000 households. These weekly groceries are life changing to families in our community. The average weekly cost of groceries in Washington State is \$287; that means The Food Bank saves just one family over \$15,000 a year.

23RD ANNUAL HARVEST DINNER

On September 30, 2023, community members, volunteers, longtime St. Mary's parishioners, and more came together again for our 23rd Annual Harvest Dinner! Hosted at the Northwest African American Museum, guests had museum exhibit access, a plated dinner, and many auction items to bid on. It was the first in-person fundraiser since 2019 and the event raised over \$150,000! All funds raised allowed us to keep our vital programs available to our community free of charge.

OUR PROGRAMS & SERVICES

<u>Walk-In:</u> This program operates every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 10 am - 1 pm. Clients can choose from selections of meat, seafood or vegetarian options, dairy, canned items, bread, fresh produce, frozen food, and dry goods. Hygiene products are also distributed as they become available.

No-Cook: This program provides about 100 homeless individuals each month with a bag of non-perishable, easy open groceries. Ready-to-eat foods such as sandwiches, salads, vegetables, and fruit are added to the bags as they are distributed to individuals. During winter, socks, hats, gloves and even sleeping bags are given when available. This program takes place during regular Walk-in dates and times.

Home Delivery: This program serves those who are low-income and home-bound whether due to age, chronic illness and/or disability. Volunteer drivers pick up and deliver groceries directly to clients residing in 16 different apartment buildings, serving about 200 people each week. Dietary restrictions and special needs are considered when preparing the bags.

<u>Food for Schools:</u> This program partners with the Seattle School District with three local sites – Washington, Middle School, Franklin High School, and Seattle World School. It ensures that children from homeless and low-income families go home with "kid-friendly," easy to open, nutritious food during the week and school holidays, and provide meals for the entire family over the weekend.

<u>Baby Corner:</u> This program distributes bags which include formula, baby food, baby wipes, diapers and household items needed by young families. We provide distributions the first full week of the month.

Mobile Food Bank: In this program, the food is brought to the Filipino Community Center and the Compass Center. The Mobile Food Bank distributes food to more than 2,200 people each month - all who mostly live in South, Central and SE Seattle.
